As to the interior life, it has been both painful and rewarding. As Mass was not allowed to be celebrated publicly, the challenge of broadcasting daily was mostly an interior challenge. It was spiritually and psychologically quite difficult!! I could feel the hunger of my spiritual children crying out – I desired to see you all, to pray with you in person and to share life with you! I could even hear you cough when I used incense. Confessions were offered throughout the pandemic, with many taking advantage of the opportunity. The students who remained in Kearney throughout took advantage of opportunities for adoration and grace sharing.

As things open, I want you to know – God is in charge of all this! He hears your cry; you matter to Him!! God knows and loves all His children; our job is simply to love Him in return. What does that look like? Love is mutual self-revelation, letting our heart be known to the other – not for our sake, but totally for the sake of the other. Let God see your heart! If you are anxious – tell Him! If you are sad, nervous, angry, happy – whatever – let Him know. Your thoughts, feelings, emotions, and desires matter – share them with God. Then, let Him respond.
