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

A Message from Fr. Hock

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from our Lord Jesus Christ!

As we move toward the close of another academic year, it is truly hard to believe this past one. It was the best of times, it was the worst of times. It is surely one we will never forget! This past quarter was one filled with much growth and joy. We celebrated the annual gathering of college students from around the country at SEEK21. This is a retreat conference that is hosted by the Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS). Usually, we gather in one place – all 18,000 of us! This year, we were unable to gather in such large numbers. So, our missionary team went about the work of making a gathering possible here in Kearney. They did a fabulous job! We had 60 students gathered in small groups all throughout our facilities here and a few others in town. Prince of Peace graciously hosted us for a holy hour at the conclusion of the conference. There was so much fruit!

Two stories from that time. First, a young woman named Bri was invited by one of our missionaries. Bri is a grad student from California. She played softball in undergrad in Iowa but found her way to UNK. Bri was able to connect to some of our small groups and has really plugged into the Newman Center this semester. She is an absolute delight and has grown tremendously in her faith. The second is Tia. Tia is from St. Patrick's in Sydney. She had not been around Newman all year, until she met one of our missionaries. They invited her into small group and Tia has been a mainstay! In fact, Tia experienced her first Sacred Triduum and was blown away!

We also celebrated for the first time in 3 semesters our Koinonia retreat. 18 participants were able to make this TEC-like retreat. There was a wonderful energy and it truly deepened our community right in the middle of our Lenten season.

As we move into this last month, we plan for our second busy person retreat and our annual St. Gianna Beretta Molla banquet which celebrates Newman the same way a family reunion celebrates. Our keynotes will be Tristan Haake, a senior from Thedford Nebraska, Fr. Kevin Vogel, a priest of the archdiocese of Omaha and a grad of UNK, and our emcee for the evening will be Laura Hawk of Ewing, Nebraska.

Friends, Jesus continues to thirst for us! He thirsts for our souls. There are so many souls on campus who we reach, but there are so many more who are just out of our grasp. When you stand on the edge of campus and look out, the thirst is palpable. Both God's thirst for their souls and their souls' thirst for God. They thirst for the kingdom of God!!

Know that we pray for each of you. Intellectual Formation is comprised of three specific programs: Bachelor of Arts Undergraduate Program Pre-Theology Program Language, Culture and Church Program

The Liberal Arts introduce the seminarians to the great human questions contained in the arts and sciences, developing the human person by exercising the intellect. The Liberal Arts:

- Encourage intellectual curiosity
- Promote critical thought
- Foster disciplined habits of study
- Teach clear and effective communication
- Introduce new ideas and the effects of culture



The Pre-Theology Program introduces the seminarian to priestly formation. Because they enter with valuable life experience, Pre-Theologians are immediately invited to leadership and service within the community.

Language, Culture and Church Program provides intensive English-language instruction to seminarians whose first language is not English.





If you haven't heard of Focus' SEEK conference, let me tell you: it is AMAZING. I look forward to it every time it comes around: which just so happens to be the deepest and grayest part of winter. College students and lay people from many walks of life gather to encounter Our Lord through the Sacraments, talks from world-renowned speakers, entertainment, and fellowship. I've had the pleasure of witnessing just how transformative it is, and this year, SEEK was centered around the Gospel message!! So, in the span of α weekend, over 60 participants in Kearney, and over 27 thousand students internationally heard the same message. They all heard that they are unique and unrepeatable; made for an everlasting relationship with the God who loved them into being. They grew in friendship and vulnerability in small groups, ate meals together, and received opportunities for restoration in the Sacraments and Adoration. (One participant returned to the Sacrament of Confession after 2 years!! Praise God!!) So many seeds were sown and I know that we are just seeing the beginning of the fruits that this conference offered to all who participated in it.

Koinonia is the Greek word for "community," which was an integral part of the faith life of the early Church.

The Koinonia retreat weekend is an introductory experience in Christian community based on the Paschal Mystery of Jesus Christ - His Passion, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension. The themes for Friday, Saturday, and Sunday are Die, Rise, and Go. Die Day is a re-enactment of the Lenten Season, Rise Day is a celebration of Easter, and Go Day is a re-visitation of Pentecost.
